Praise to the Lord! O let all that is in me adore him! All that has life and breath, come now with praises before him. Let the Amen sound from his people again; gladly forever adore him.



3. The pattern of true worship is the truth

Truth in John: 1:14; 7:18; 14:6; 16:13; 17:17
